

WHAT IS A SENATOR?

A member of the senate that makes decisions representing the best interests of the student body. Senators will initiate and consider legislation, all appointments, and expenditures from various committees. The senate is comprised of fifteen students; four students from the Freshman, Sophomore, and Junior classes and three students from the Senior class.

HOW TO BECOME A SENATOR

To get on the ballot, students will need to get fifty signatures on the petition and turned into the Vice President, PMB 1542. The student will then be voted on by their student body. If there is a vacancy express interest to the President who will then bring it to a vote in the senate.

DUTIES OF SENATORS

- Attend all senate meetings
- Utilize the right to vote at senate and committee meetings
- Serve on assigned Committees- Special Projects, Constitution, Finance, Community Outreach, Student Life, and MAC

Represent the best interests of the Student Body

- Serve a minimum of one office hour a week
- Participate in a minimum of one MSG offered volunteering event each semester in office

Maintain at least a 2.0 GPA through the duration of the term.
